➤Wonderfully Made By God's Grace



We'll explore how the Almighty Maker gives worth and purpose that make every neighbor a gift and privilege from fertilization to forever – no matter what age, appearance, or ability!

➤ Wonderfully Made As Male and Female

How do our bodies reflect and confess the grace of God? For what privileges and responsibilities has He made us male and female? How does He safeguard these gifts? How can we incorporate and care for individuals experiencing suffering and temptation related to sexuality and gender? How may we speak truth and show love in such sensitive situations? We will be motivated by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We will examine instruction from Scripture, engage observations of science, and explore opportunities for servanthood.

➤ Wonderfully Made For Needing One Another

Do disabilities justify abortion and assisted suicide? Are there some conditions not worth living? How can Christians affirm God's gift of life in situations of pain, impairment, or advancing age? What joy and hope does the Gospel of Jesus Christ offer for enduring suffering? We'll discover blessings that more than make up for bodily burdens, and we'll encounter opportunities even greater than autonomy, productivity, or comfort.
