President's Message

Dear LWML Sisters in Christ.

Have you ever read a familiar Bible verse that had a new profound effect on you? One such verse for me is *She shall bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he shall save his people from their sins* (Matthew 1:21). I must have been in my 30's when it struck me! The angel was telling Joseph that the preborn infant Mary was carrying would save His people from their sins. God's plan from Genesis would be fulfilled, and generations later, as one of HIS people, I am saved from MY sins (and so are you)! Thanks be to God!

Lent is an opportunity to prepare our hearts for Easter; an opportunity to take time to reflect and digest God's Word. Have you taken time to plan how you will use this opportunity? If not, consider utilizing resources found on the LWML website. Begin with What an Opportunity - Lenten Devotion, consider Lenten Bible Journaling or Read Through the Bible in One Year. Take time to learn how Your Mite Offerings Have Made an Impact and be encouraged to continue those mite offerings by using the Mite Challenge Calendar (monthly). In your LWML Group (society) consider using LWML Resources for Lent and explore Mission Service Activities to identify program resources and new mission service projects.

Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, marks the beginning of the 40 days of Lent. Take time during the month of February to prepare how you will use the Lenten opportunity to prepare your heart for Easter. Select resources for your personal devotional time, and consider sharing resources with your LWML sisters, and focus on what our Savior did for you. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not of your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result

of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them (Ephesians 2:8-10).

As Lutheran Women in Mission we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions and equip women to honor God by serving others. As Lutheran Women in Mission we study God's Word faithfully, support LCMS missions through prayers and mite offerings, and provide opportunities for the women in our congregations to serve others through mission service activities at group, zone, and district events. Together we Serve the Lord with Gladness! (Psalm 100:2).

So this Lent, whether you are reading familiar Bible passages, a new devotion, trying Lenten Bible Journaling or <u>Scripture Doodles</u>, it is my prayer that you find time to abide in God's Word and are stirred up in the faith that leads to eternal life.

My dear sisters in Christ,

Can you believe that winter is almost halfway through? Okay, that made me laugh a little, too. You never know what April and May might bring. Still, we've gotten through the darker nights and will soon move into the lighter days. It's a wonderful time to be alive.

Our Heart to Heart Sisters (H2H) will be meeting soon to celebrate the different ethnic backgrounds in our wonderful district. Will you be coming? This year's theme, "United in Christ: Celebrating Our Unique Stories," is based on Galatians 3:28.

It might seem strange to have the idea of "uniqueness" right next to the idea of "united." In fact, Paul seems to say we're not unique, right? We are all one in Christ Jesus, after all.

But that's not what Paul is saying at all. We are one in Christ Jesus, but one body, His body. Each body, as you know, is composed of many members. In the body of Christ, we are composed of different ethnicities, backgrounds, upbringings, and languages, and those make us unique! No one is quite like you. No one knows you like you do. You have a story and perspective only you bring to the table.

That's why H2H meets every year: to discover those stories, raise up Lutheran women leaders in ethnic ministries, bring women of different backgrounds into the LWML, and most of all, to be together. As the one body of Christ, we should celebrate every time we get to be together, and we do.

We hear the stories of women who came to

the faith by the call of the Spirit. We enjoy the tastes and sounds of different families. But, more than this, we celebrate our oneness in Jesus Christ.

Mission Grant #3 Check Presentation

The favorite part of my new position as VP of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants is presenting the mission grant checks to the grant recipients. Grant #3 is my third check presentation since I took office in June 2024! It was my pleasure to present the check for grant #3 — SWD Church Work Student Grant — to Rev. Dr. Nathan Meador, Mission Executive of our SWD LCMS. The check for \$30,000 was presented to him at the LWML SWD Winter Getaway that took place January 31–February 1 at Cranberry Country Lodge in Tomah.

These funds are managed by the SWD LCMS and are distributed in the fall and spring to students at our two LCMS seminaries in St. Louis and Ft. Wayne. The grant money will be given to assist students with the cost of their education while studying and preparing for full-time church work. This includes not only pastors but also teachers, deaconesses, DCE, DCO, director of church ministry, parish music, or family life.

The cost of preparing our future church workers is high with the average unmet need per student being approximately \$23,000. Many of the seminary students also have families that must be supported, which would cause stress for the students, so this mission greatly appreciated. From previous grant is "Your recipients: support has instrumental in making the cost of my studies more manageable." "I appreciate the financial assistance and spiritual support alike. It wouldn't be possible for me to pursue church work without it."

I would also like to thank all those hands that dropped the pennies, nickels, dimes, quarters, and the paper money into their Mite Boxes. All those individual Mite Boxes add up to thousands of dollars that will be given to organizations to further the Word of our Lord

Jesus Christ and His love for us.





Update on Mission Grants

2023–2025 Mission Grant 30 - SHOWERING LOVE ON THE LEAST OF THESE | Mercy Holistic Ministry CA - \$100,000 PAID IN FULL!

Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) is a Sacramento, California, based organization, established in 2010, that provides dignified holistic services to restore and transform the lives of the homeless community in and around the city. Its ministry partners include various area LCMS congregations.

In 2021, MHM purchased a two-stall shower trailer, literally bringing showers and the Gospel to the location of the homeless. Beyond showers, MHM provides personal hygiene kits, haircuts, clean clothing, and food to the people who come. They offer the opportunity to speak with someone who can pray for them, provide active listening, and give referrals to other services, such as shelters. Bibles and prayer books are shared.

This grant will enable MHM to offer an additional day per week of service and to purchase and retrofit a mobile closet trailer for clean clothing and hygiene kit storage.

LWML Convention Travel for SWD

Are you planning to go to the LWML convention in Omaha on June 26–29 this year? If so, how are you planning to get there? How are you planning to get from the hotel to the convention center?

The Sonshine Express Motorcoach will be leaving early in the morning on Wednesday, June 25, from Peace Lutheran Church in Beaver Dam. We are planning to make a stop to pick up additional passengers at one of the LCMS churches in Janesville. We are not deterring off of our planned path on Hwy. 26 for additional pick-ups as we want to be able to make the trip with one driver getting us to Omaha on Wednesday late afternoon or early evening.

No tours are planned in conjunction with this travel, but you may sign up on the convention website for the convention sponsored tours that fit within your schedule to Lauritzen Gardens, Durham Museum, or a College World Series game at Charles Schwab Field, or any other tour.

Of the people who had signed up in 2024 as interested in riding the motorcoach, the majority stated that they wanted to return Sunday, June 29, after the closing service, so that is what we will do. People can pick up their box lunch and head to the motorcoach. Box lunches will be eaten on the motorcoach as we head home.

If you will be a voting delegate (i.e., you are the zone president or substituting for the zone president), the cost of this transportation will be paid by LWML SWD. If you are not the voting delegate, the cost will be approximately \$165 for this round-trip travel, including



being taken from the door of the hotel to/from the door of the convention center daily.

I make the hotel reservations for those riding on the motorcoach, so be prepared to tell me who you want to share a room with, or I can help pair you with someone else who is riding on the motorcoach. We will want to get our hotel reservations in as soon as possible so that we get our first choice of hotel. That is why I am asking you to let me know your intention to ride with us by March 15.

Space on the motorcoach is limited, so if you wish to ride on the Sonshine Express, please email me at the address below as soon as possible. At the BOD meeting in February, I will be confirming with EC members and other committee members who are still planning to ride the motorcoach. General registrations of non-committee members for traveling by motorcoach will be accepted as space permits. If there are more than the 48 that we can fit on the motorcoach, I will assist with trying to combine with the North Wisconsin District LWML.

Greetings! I would like to thank everyone for a wonderful nine months of giving! At the end of December, our current biennium mite contributions total \$95,539.64 (\$76,339.19 for the SWD and \$19,200.45 for LWML). We need to bring in \$124,461 to complete the biennial goal we have set (\$220,000). We have 15 months to complete this task, at an average of \$8,297 per month.



After delegate voting, the first 7 grants above will be fully funded and the 8th one will be partially funded, as noted.
