From our Junior Pastoral Counselor

You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here (Mark 16:6b).

My Dear Sisters,

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

With those words, most of us began our Easter worship, found them in the sermon (likely multiple times), and concluded our time together before going back to our homes. Easter is just this magnificent season of celebration of joy and hope and peace and wonder and excitement.

But, if you were one of the women who went to the tomb in Mark's Gospel, it was anything but those things. It was a day of fear and doubt and uncertainty and astonishment and trembling. They didn't completely understand everything that was going on. All they knew was that there was a strange young man sitting in the tomb of Jesus that had been strangely open, the guard strangely disappeared, and a body strangely missing.

The original ending of Mark seems to end there with the women being afraid, and for Mark's Gospel, that makes sense. Mark is based on the preaching notes of the Apostle Peter. After this story, Peter would be delivering to those who would hear and believe the message of Jesus Christ the crucified and risen body and blood of Jesus Christ in the Lord's Supper. He would remind them of the promises Jesus gave them, even as Jesus gave them all through the Gospel of Mark. (The longer ending of Mark, I believe, may have been added by Mark or someone close to him a bit later, maybe even after Peter died, so that it didn't end on fear, but hope, but that's another story for another time.)

For those women, they didn't have that hope yet. They didn't see the full ending of the story just yet. They wanted to know it, and it was just out of reach, but it was coming. Until then, until they saw Jesus with their eyes, until they saw the fulfillment of all His promises, they would be fearful.

But, thank God, they were witnesses to the resurrection. They saw Jesus. They sat with Him, ate with Him, learned more from Him. They gave their accounts to the Apostles and all of it was written down for us to believe nearly 2000 years after the fact. We have their witness, and we can believe it is true. They thought they would find Him in the tomb, but He wasn't there, for, just as said, He is risen (He is risen indeed! Alleluia!).

For us, we come seeking Jesus, too. Only, we don't seek Him in the tomb. We seek the risen Lord where He's promised to be. We seek Him in Word and Sacrament, and because He is risen (He is risen indeed! Alleluia!), He has promised that we will find Him there. He's not on the cross. He's not in the tomb. He's not anywhere but where He's always promised to be—with us always, even unto the end of the age, in your ears, in your mouth, and upon your forehead. He is with you, for He is risen! (He is risen indeed! Alleluia!)



One of the big preparations for this summer's convention is the finalizing of the mission grants ballot. Delegates will be choosing the slate of those that will be funded over the next biennium. With a proposed mission grant goal of \$220,000, we will be looking to fund 75% of that amount, \$165,000. The remaining 25% is directed to national for their mission grant budget. To prepare for the vote, you may see a summary of the 23 grants which are posted on the website, *lwml-swd.org*. Look under the 'Convention News' heading and be in prayer, because each of these is worthy of our support, but only a few will be chosen.

Because I live in the Sheboygan area, it was easy for me to present the final mission grant check to Pastor David Blas and congregation chairman, Javiar Zavarce, on Easter Sunday. The amount of \$11,060 is designed to assist this growing Hispanic Ministry in Sheboygan County with the purchase of video and audio equipment to be able to tell the many stories of how God has blessed this work among us. Worshiping membership continues to grow through visitors, baptisms, and adult confirmations, but because of the nature of the membership, additional monetary assistance is needed.

The annual Heart to Heart Sisters of All Nations event was well attended. Please read the special article in this issue of the *Mission Lamp* for a full recap.

The position of VP of Special Focus Ministries and Mission Grants will be filled by another of our great LWML ladies following the convention. The past four years, for me, has been a challenge and a learning experience. I have grown to appreciate the tremendous amount of work it takes from a cadre of capable individuals to keep this organization running smoothly. Each has a unique talent that weaves itself into the beautiful picture we have of the LWML here in the South Wisconsin District. Take pride in that! Praise God for it! And offer your talents for its continuation!

The day began with registration by receiving materials that cover the plans of the event from the registrar. Pastor Donald Hougard (Benediction) had prepared an inspirational service and included five of our Milwaukee area ethnic pastors. He also preached a sermon of encouragement to keep up with the historical precedence of meeting people in their need, including those of other ethnic backgrounds. The final moments of benediction by those five pastors, each in their own language, reinforced the purpose of the day, opening our eyes to what is in front of us in our own neighborhoods.

Who could argue with the variety of food? No one! Choices were from Chinese, Hmong, Lebanese, African, German, and United States backgrounds. Benediction Lutheran hosted the event and did a fine job coordinating this. To be sure, there was enough dessert to satisfy everyone's sweet tooth.

Kristen Kolell led a demonstration on how to prepare a German beer dip in one of the breakout sessions. In the other session, Esther Ndon and Naomi Akpan demonstrated the art of headwraps that are so popular among African women. We were in awe at the beauty and talent it takes to do this, and the senses of sight and taste cued us up for an appreciation of other cultures.

LWML SWD was honored to have in attendance the Chairman of the LWML Heart to Heart Sisters of All Nations Committee, Mrs. Ann Campbell from Holland, Michigan. She was there to gather information that might be useful for other districts as they undertake to inspire others around the United States. Also curious about our event was Coral Rose from Minnesota, who thoroughly enjoyed it. Note: two of our LWML sisters serve on this national committee, Joanna Ellis and Joan Anderson.

Food and entertainment on the same day!! Our eyes and ears were elated to witness the beauty of dance by a group of young dancers from the Hmong community and another group from the Karenni community. Now, our ears perked up and our eyes lit up at the beauty and grace of ethnic dancing. The day came to a close and people were left to ponder in their own hearts what God is calling them to do after receiving God's natural light from above and the light of God's Son in their hearts.

Thanks qoes to the hard working committee: Chairman Joanna Ellis, Cheryl Lambrecht, Eugenia Ellis, Mai Nhia Thao Kruse, Patricia Silah, LuAnn Roman, and Pastors Gehrke and Polzin. To be sure that this event continues, new members are encouraged to Joanna joining contact Ellis about the committee.

LWML Gifts of Love Ministry

A good gift plan can present solutions to challenging family dynamics.

Years ago, a husband and wife were meeting with their LWML Gift Planning Counselor. Both had been married before, as their spouses had been called home to Jesus. Each of them brought children into the relationship. The assets they brought were not equal. Urged by the advice of various people, they began considering a way in which they could isolate their assets from each other, creating multiple trusts. Complicating matters, because they truly loved each other, they wanted to provide for each other when the first of them was called home. They felt uncomfortable about such absolute separation of their assets if they truly were going to share their lives as "one flesh," in keeping with the model of marriage from Genesis 2. They laid out a complicated stream of thoughts before the LWML Gift Planning Counselor. After a lengthy conversation, the counselor noticed an interesting phenomenon about their assets relative to family. Coming into this marriage, one spouse had twice as many financial assets as the other. That same spouse with the greater assets also had twice as many children as the other spouse. The ratio made sense. If they combined their assets and equally divided them among all their children, each child would receive the same amount as if they had put in place a complicated legal set of trusts to separate their assets. The Gift Planning Counselor conveyed a message to their attorney, and they emerged from that attorney with a simple plan that made them feel content. The plan they created together also allowed them to make some gifts to support ministry in the future. In addition, this plan did not foster an imposed separation between their children.

Taking the time for extended conversation and prayer allowed this couple to discern the right thing to do, rather than pursuing plans that would be expensive, complicated, and less than satisfying. 

LWML Mission Grant Proposal form now available

Mission Grant Proposals for the 2025 Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML) Convention in Omaha can now be submitted.

Only LWML members, groups, zones, or districts can officially submit grant proposals. The only exception is the LCMS Office of International or National Mission.

Mission Grant Proposal Guidelines and the electronic submission form can be found on the LWML website under the 'Missions' tab.

The primary criteria for every proposal submitted is that the grant recipient will share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, through evangelism, teaching, and service to others. The submission deadline is September 1, 2024. (Note: LWML and LCMS District Presidents are responsible for reviewing your proposal and approving with their electronic signature.)

Prayerfully consider the ministry and needs worldwide as well as in your district and submit a grant proposal. For over 80 years the message of salvation has gone around the world with the support of mite contributions from Lutheran Women in Mission.

How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? (Romans 10:14, 15a).


