What is the PRIZE?

At the recent district convention, your LWML SWD approved a Biennium goal of \$204,500 with nine mission grants to fund.

Wow! I don't know about you, but my mind sometimes becomes focused on the sheer amount of this goal. The phrase "Keep your eye on the prize" keeps popping into my head. I wonder, "What is the prize LWML SWD is working to achieve?" We all know it isn't really a "prize" we are seeking. But if not a prize, then what are we trying to achieve? What IS the focus of the LWML?

The answer can be traced back to the very first LWML convention 1942. Helping needy in their local communities had been a focus for LWML women (as far back as the 1850's!) but the attending women recognized a greater need for mission works, supporting the proclamation of the Gospel to extend beyond their communities. Those founding women of the LWML knew the "prize" (FOCUS) of LWML and set out to achieve this purpose.

The focus of your LWML today remains the same. MISSIONS!

God gives us direction in the following scriptures: "No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light." Luke 11:33

We can easily become distracted by the financial amounts of the LWML goals. Did we pay off a project or what is the financial shortage? Is the goal too much or too little? All too quickly our focus becomes the dollar amounts of the projects and not doing the mission work itself. The founding women of LWML put their focus on missions - let us all be reminded of their vision and continue to focus not on finances but MISSIONS and spreading the gospel.

And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." Luke 10:2 ESV



So said my daughter, Monica, missionary wife to Dr. Edward Naumann, Theological Educator in Sri Lanka for the past two years. Their planned trip to the US was wrought with questions about visas, permission process, etc. In addition, a move out of the apartment where they were living was in the works. Finally, they said, "We are coming. We will trust the visa permits will come through while we are in the US and living arrangements will work out." Translate this into the hundreds of missionaries serving in different parts of the world, and you can see that Satan has his hand in lots of ways to discourage God's servants.

It is God's tugging on the hearts of individuals to lead them to mission work whether here or abroad and His blessings in the process that gives us the list of workers in His Kingdom actively involved as career or short-term missionaries.
