



Over the past 79 years, God has blessed these donations to bring His saving message to multitudes. Throughout the LWML's history, over 100 million dollars have been gathered to spread the Gospel message.



2023 LWML District Banner General Instructions

The Banner Processional at LWML conventions sets the tone for the convention and we, as one of the host districts, are to develop a new banner. Please take a moment to think about a design for the LWML SWD using the theme, "Celebrate the Lord of Nations," and someone who would be willing to sew the banner together. All ideas are great whether they are simple pencil drawings or complete renditions. Send your ideas by Thursday, December 1, 2022, to Claudia Fairfield, VP Organizational Resources, at <u>vporganizationalresources@lwml-swd.org</u> or mail them to 626 South Main, Westfield, WI 53964.

General banner specifications:

- 1. Finished banner size is to be 3' x 5'. Added fringe may be longer. The banner should be easy to manage when carried. Heavy fabrics and bulky items make carrying the banner difficult.
- 2. Your district's name (can be abbreviated) must be on the front of the banner. Use any size letters you wish. Place a small identifying tag naming your district on the lower left corner on the backside of the banner, to help identify your district banner when rolled up.
- 3. Attach two ties to the back of the banner. One of the ties is to be at the center of the banner width, about 10-12" from the top. The second tie is to be at the center of the banner width, about 10-12" from the bottom. These ties should be long enough to tie a bow around a two-inch pole. Note: Do NOT use Velcro to hold banner to the pole, as it has proved ineffective. Please use ties as described.
- 4. Tack the casing at the bottom of the banner to keep the dowel in place.
- 5. At the top, attach the banner to a one-inch dowel with an eye screw on each end of the dowel. Please use a strong 1/4-inch or 8mm cord. Make a small loop at the center for hanging. Secure the cording through each eye screw, laying the cord flat along the dowel, with the small loop at the center of the banner. Knot the cord on the outside of each screw. Be sure to attach the cord tightly since they tend to stretch when the banner is hanging. Have your banner hang before convention to allow time for stretching.

Engage in Missions by Funding Missions!

Greetings! I am the new Financial Secretary for the term 2022-2026 and am excited to serve in this position. I would like to thank Marilyn Belter, past Financial Secretary, and Patty Silah, Treasurer, for their advice and help! I look forward to meeting many of you at retreats or convention.

Speaking of retreats, at the SWD Fall Retreat in September, our generous sisters in Christ blessed the LCMS Sheboygan County Hispanic Ministry with a gift of \$2,102! Mites collected totaled \$631.09! Thank you, ladies!

We also paid the third 2022-2024 mission grant in September, the SWD Church Student Worker Grant of \$30,000, and at this writing we are working towards funding our fourth grant of Financial Assistance for CTS, Fort Wayne Food and Clothing Co-op of \$10,000. Our mite goal for the 2022-2024 biennium is \$205,000, with \$153,750 designated for SWD Mission Grants and \$51,250 for LWML Mission Grants.

The LWML SWD Fall Retreat was held on September 23-24, 2022, in Fond du Lac at the Radisson Hotel and Convention Center. Our theme was "Empowered by God's Grace," with the Bible verse, *I can do all things through Him who strengthens me* (Philippians 4:13).

There were 151 in attendance. We learned more about our God-given gifts and how we may use them in our daily lives through our keynote speaker, Karol Selle. Our retreat offerings were divided between the Sheboygan County Hispanic Outreach (3/4) and the Female Church Workers Scholarship Fund (1/4).

Gifts from the Heart donations totaled 695 items for the Fondy Food Pantry, including 217 jars of peanut butter, 122 bags of cereal, 249 fruit and applesauce containers, 144 laundry detergent containers, and 63 miscellaneous items that will help those in need in the Fond du Lac area.

There were a variety of servant events offered during free time, both Friday night and Saturday, for everyone to enjoy and take part of, which included making two church banners with interchangeable words and pictures that reflect the words. These banners will be going to the Sheboygan County Hispanic Outreach Ministry for use during their church services.

Forty cancer care packages (with most items obtained through a Thrivent grant) will be given to the Sheboygan County Cancer Care Fund. Included in these were a tie-dye drawstring

bag, scarf, cushy seatbelt cover, hand lotion, chocolate candies, a colored card of encouragement, and a handmade crocheted heart. These will be distributed to those going through breast cancer treatments.

Colored cards and bookmarks will be given to veterans and others to let them know we are thinking about them. We also held a pumpkin painting and decorating area, where everyone was able to get creative, with many ideas ranging from painting sunflowers and Bible verses to decorating with fall foliage, etc. The finished creations could then be taken into the main conference room to decorate the center of each table for all to enjoy or taken home to add some autumn cheer into their lives. There was a lot of fellowship time at the retreat, and it was great to see everyone enjoying themselves.

The Fall Retreat was a wonderful event that I was so glad to be a part of, with the help of God, the committee and everyone else that helped make it great. I encourage you to sign up to help with an event like this. It is a great opportunity to work with and get to know fellow LWML sisters.

Update on Orphan Grain Train—Wisconsin (an LCMS RSO)

We have heard from Orphan Grain Train—Wisconsin and they have three requests:

- 1. Prayers that the upcoming containers are able to be shipped on time to Liberia, Moldova and Liberia. They hope to have another container going to Ukraine in November.
- 2. Supplies are needed for the Ukrainian people this winter. There are areas with no electricity, food, and other essentials. Costs have also skyrocketed. Donations of new pillows, sleeping bags -0 or lower temperatures, sleeping mats that are off the ground, winter coats, shoes and boots for all ages, warm gloves, mittens, hats, scarves, new long underwear for all ages, 3'x6' or 7' folding tables, quilts, warm bedding, new warm socks and underwear, CO2 monitors for tents, baby, toddler, children and adult warm clothing. Ukraine winters are much like Wisconsin winters.
- 3. Monetary donations to buy food and cover shipping costs. We serve the God who owns the cattle on a thousand hills, He is our great provider and He knows the needs we have!! But often He moves through the hearts of His precious people, so we wanted to let you know our needs. Please don't feel like we are asking for big gifts, unless you feel so led, a small gift goes a long way when we all join together as the hands and feet of Christ!! You are all a true blessing to us, and we give thanks to God for each one of you!! This year Wisconsin will have sent out close to 40 containers and loads! We could not do what we do without you!!

Please again, most importantly keep our Wisconsin branch in your prayers for God's wisdom, guidance and provision! And if you can keep our containers covered in your prayers, we would be

deeply thankful!! Please feel free to share this with other OGT family and friends who you think might like our update.

Donation Day Fort Wayne Seminary

Thank you, LWML!

While attending Donation Day at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana on October 11, 2022 the words I heard over and over were "thank you." 
