#### My Dear Sisters,

Coming home after the Fall Retreat and thinking about this Mission Lamp article, I was trying to think of a Bible verse that would be suitable for describing it, but every single one I found with that specific word, "retreat," really only has to do with armies running away. So, in lieu of that, let's put our focus for a moment on the first words of the Fall Retreat's Biblical theme.

First, the Fall Retreat went spectacularly, especially due to the work of so many faithful servants. Thank you to all!


Of course, with this coming right at the start of fall, right when the temperature begins to change for the cooler, my heart keeps wanting that nice blanket on my lap in the crisp air, the fire roaring beside me, a cup of steaming coffee in my hands, a hooded sweatshirt right on my neck. These are comfort things for me. I don't know if it's something ingrained in me by my parents early on, or if I've caught too many commercials for Hallmark movies, but the fall just feels comfortable and comforting.

But, as lovely as the fall is, it is nowhere near so comforting as what we have in Christ. Think about this for a moment: who is your Father? To sinners, the Father is a scary being who needs to punish sin and cast people into hell for rejecting Him. Not everyone recognizes that, of course, but many do, and thus they reject God, thinking that if they say they don't belong to Him that makes it true. Nothing could be further from the truth, however; all of creation belongs to Him and He will fulfill His promises and threats. But, for us who are saved by Christ, our Father isn't scary; He has no threats for you. He's "Our Father," one whom we should think of as welcoming us as we race excitedly to Him. It works like this: Our God is the God of comfort, but He is the Father of Jesus Christ, too. Thus, if we are in Jesus and He in us, then the Father is "Our Father," which has to be the most comforting thing ever. We lack no comfort when we belong to Christ because He makes the Father our own. And if the Father is yours, then He is a good one, taking care of your needs and comforting you with the sweet words of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

The Father has welcomed you, His children, to His family through His Son that you may be His and that He may give you all mercy and grace, all comfort, through Jesus' death and resurrection. As wonderful as it is to cozy up to a warm fire in cool air, the comfort we have in Christ is something eternal and something that doesn't go away with the changing of the seasons. The Father is yours forever, never changing, and always bringing His Son, Jesus, to you so that you may have life in His name by His cross.



The 2024 LWML SWD Convention planning is well underway!

**Save the date** for LWML SWD Convention: Friday, June 14–Saturday, June 15, 2024. **Location**: Bethlehem Lutheran Church, 300 Broadway Dr., Sun Prairie, Wis. The theme for the upcoming convention is "Chosen to Love & Serve" based on the verse, *Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience* (Col. 3:12).

The purpose statement is: Women of the LWML SWD are gathering to carry out the business/mission of the LWML and be strengthened through His Spirit to continue to love and serve. The convention goal is: Attendees, loved and served by Christ, will be empowered by the Spirit to grow in their faith so that they can love and serve.

# Pray without ceasing!

#### **Grant Recipients Express Thanks!**

Now that we are nearing the end of the 2022– 24 grant cycle, it is good to be reminded that our mites turn into acts of mercy by the agencies that receive them. We ask that grant recipients let us know what happens with those dollars. Here are snippets of those reports.

**Bethany Lutheran Church** in Milwaukee found the timing for their grant to be "at the right time." Their aged building experienced some structural damage needing repair to the main entrance into the building. "This grant money allows Bethany to continue reaching out to Milwaukee's inner city, the Burmese congregation who uses our building for worship, and the people from the House of Correction, as Pastor Afam (Ikanih) invites them to join our Bible studies and worship." They have successfully hosted two block parties over the summer, bearing witness to the scope of God's allencompassing love for their neighbors.

The Wisconsin branch of **Orphan Grain Train** received \$15,000 early in the cycle. "This year most of the money was used to ship food and aid over to the Ukraine! As you know, this war has been daunting and relentless." OGT ships to pastors and missionaries who receive them and who distribute, giving them opportunities to reach into the lives of people around them to share the good news of Jesus Christ! Their report further states, "Please relay our deepest gratitude to the LWML for their love and service to those in need. This organization, the LWML, is amazing!"

**Doxology - Care for Clergy Wives** was recently fully funded in the amount of \$8,000! More information on how these funds will impact their ministry will be shared soon.

And finally, the **SOS Center** in Milwaukee is about to receive the full amount (instead of partial) of their request. Lydia Beasley commented..."please pass a thank you to all the others for their hard work and generosity and love. To be able to partner with people who have the same mission (serve Christ) is more than wonderful." She also invites you to view their purple room at the center, 4620 W. North Ave. in Milwaukee, which is dedicated to the LWML!

Grant applications for the next biennium (2024 –2026) had to be postmarked by October 31, 2023. If you submitted a grant proposal, stay tuned for updates as the process moves along.

A new position has formed, replacing the Deaf Liaison Coordinator, previously on the books. Anne Herlihy is the **Special Ministry Advocate** who will be seeking ways for us to adequately reach out and ultimately bring into active membership those with hearing/ vision/cognitive challenges as well as those physically disabled. Welcome, Anne.

As Deaconess Intern, I am learning and serving under Chaplain Derek Wolter's mentorship to help provide spiritual care for our long-term residents, rehabilitation clients, and their families. I am also a support for our staff members. I participate in the residents' daily life through Bible studies, individual visits, serving in the dining room, and other group activities. During the most difficult times of loss, loneliness, pain, suffering, doubt, or despair, I am also called upon to bring Christ's love and comfort to those in need.

One project I am helping to coordinate, thanks to a request from a lovely local LWML member, is making no-sew fleece blankets (in the colors of the church calendar!) for use by the residents who come to chapel Sunday mornings. We have found fleece to be the most durable material for blankets as they stand up to the hot wash/hot dry sanitary requirements. We would love for you to be a part of this project. #### **EXCITING CHANGES ARE COMING!**

There are exciting changes in the air, and I am not talking about the change from summer to fall. The exciting changes are occurring in some LWML groups in our district. All glory goes to God, our Father, for setting apart a few LWML women willing to "step out of their comfort zone." Recently someone shared with me what is happening with their small local group of five women. She asked not to be identified at this time, so I will call her 'Lucy LWML.' Like many of our LWML groups, this one was very discouraged as their group continued to diminish and they had little hope of having other women from their congregation join them, but God had a plan for them! He brought Lucy LWML to them! She and her husband had recently moved to Wisconsin to be closer to kids and grandkids. Lucy already loved LWML and WANTED to be part of their group! As it often happens, after a very short time, Lucy became the President of the group. No one else would take the position and she only agreed if everyone would help and they were open to doing a few things differently. They revamped the style of their meetings and made a commitment to personally invite other women in the congregation, even though they "tried that before." It was hard to make these changes. The changes resulted in seven new members in less than a year! Since there will be "the rest of the story," Lucy LWML wanted to share just a few bullet points about the changes they made. I have listed her bullet points and in the () are notes I have added.

- Build a relationship before you say anything about LWML. Give it time to grow. Always be positive and smiling. Be happy!
- Start telling people what LWML is doing and the fun and sisterhood developing.

- Have six months of meetings planned. The details will come later. (Need planning help? Go to lwml-swd.org. Click on the Resource tab and then the Society Helps tab. You will find "Equipping Saints to Serve 2023–2025." This will take you to the planner. Then scroll down to enable downloading or printing of the planner if so desired. It is FREE)!
- Invite them face to face or put a handmade invitation in their mailbox and be sure to ask them if they got the invitation.
- Do not be discouraged if they do not come for a while. They are waiting to see if it is something they will like. (LWML activities need to be visible to the rest of the congregation; bulletin announcements, articles in the church's newsletter, posters on bulletin boards, and in the women's restroom).
- Make sure when they do come you greet them with a smile. Do not let them stand alone. Assign someone that is uplifting to help them in the meeting.
- Thank them for coming. (Not just AT the meeting, but have someone mail them a thank you note).
- Keep talking to them when you see them. (It doesn't just need to be at church, but if you see them at the grocery store or restaurant).
- Have the Bible study first, and then new mothers can leave if they need to. They will receive an email with what happened at the meeting so that they do not miss something, and this will build their interest.
- Revamp your meeting. We email the Treasurer report, Secretary report, and anything else that comes up so we can avoid reading them at the meeting.

- I then ask if there are any changes or corrections, and if not, we as a group approve it.
- We then discuss anything as a group that is coming up and we all plan it. It is not for one person to do alone.
- We try to keep the meeting joyful with laughter and doing things they can enjoy while still building relationships with one another, such as painting tea towels, making a banner, having a lunch. (LWML rallies are a great place to chat with other LWML groups to see what activities/servant projects worked well for them).
- Stay on time!! Do not linger on any subject. Know when to stop the meeting!

What a joy it was to talk with Lucy LWML. It was such an encouragement to me! I don't know about you, but I can't wait to hear ... **the rest of the story.**

#### Who Will Be the Next LWML SWD Treasurer?

My role as your LWML SWD Treasurer is to pay all of the LWML SWD bills, so I am privileged to pay our mite grants, our female church worker scholarships, and our administrative expenses, including paying the costs of delegates to the LWML conventions, the expenses for our LWML SWD conventions, and the costs of fall retreats and winter getaways. It has been amazing to be presenting mite grant checks to our recipients, and see their joy and gratitude. Most of the checks are printed by using bank software so we don't use much postage, envelopes, or check stock any more.







### TIPS FOR REVIEWING ZONE BYLAWS

#### Bylaws should:

- Be short and concise. Keep the bylaws simple.
  - \* Only include rules that the organization considers too important that they cannot be changed without notice and by a large majority. Ones that cannot be suspended.
  - \* Consider putting details in Bylaw Standing Rules or in guidelines.
- Include reference to individual members of the LWML.
- Be carefully worded to avoid misunderstanding and confusion.
- Be consistent in terminology. (Use of the LWML Style Guide is suggested.)
- Be consistent in punctuation and capitalization (especially if using lists).
- Have all pages numbered and dated.

#### As you start, check your current bylaws for:

- Outdated procedures
- Contradictions
- Lack of consistency (especially in capitalization and punctuation)
- Similar objects not grouped together
- Too many details
- Incomplete information
- Lack of dates

#### Process for Amendments and/or Revisions:

- Zone BOD arranges for a review of existing bylaws.
- Submit suggested amendments or revisions to the groups in the zone for their input.
- Submit suggested amendments or revisions to the SWD Structure Committee for review/ approval.
  - \* For wording to be deleted, put in red Strikethrough ((<del>like so</del>)
  - \* For wording to be added, put in blue type (like so)

- Submit final bylaw document to the groups to review.
- Adopt the final bylaw document at a zone rally.
- Email the approved bylaws to the SWD Structure Committee Chairman for filing.

#### Funding Our Final Mission Grants!



That makes 40 years of sharing the love of Christ with those who come through their doors. The after school program helps with homework and provides a safe and loving environment and the Born to Lead because Christ Leads Us group works with high school and young adults in leadership training. The grant reassures the staff and volunteers that what they do is important. They wish to expand and add a focused group for young ladies, Irreplaceable Gems, through which they will learn to love and respect themselves because they are children of God. A grief support group for children and youth is also a need they wish to address.

Grant #12 Hispanic Outreach Sheboygan **County** - Communication and Ministry Partnership \$11,060 - Over seven years ago, visionaries in Sheboygan County conceived a plan to reach out to the growing Hispanic community in their midst. Many churches and individuals got on board to support this ministry since it involves the specialized preaching/teaching in the language of the people. The outreach has resulted in a flourishing congregation meeting weekly for Bible Study and service Newcomers have Spanish. been in catechized and children baptized. The vision now is to continue and expand on this beginning but it will take new sources of revenue to provide financial support and prayers. This grant is instrumental in developing the visual message that will be shared, and for the training of local persons to carry on the work of spreading the message of the Hispanic Outreach with the goal of securing support for many years to come.
